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Farm Fresh Produce Begins at Home

Vegetable gardening can be a rewarding and productive hobby if you follow a few simple guidelines listed below.

Site Selection and Soil Preparation

Choose a site that receives 6-8 hours of direct sun.

Amend your soil with compost or aged manure every year and dig/till to a depth of at least 6 inches...or use a raised bed to grow your crop.

Keep weeds in check throughout the season. Base your fertilizer application on the specific crop you'd like to grow.

Pick Varieties for our Region

Our season is relatively short. So, you will have the most success by choosing varieties that have the shortest maturity date.

Timing

There are basically two types of vegetable crops, cool season and warm season. Cool season varieties will be able to withstand cold temperatures if they are first hardened off. So, you will be able to plant them earlier. However, warm season varieties will require consistent night time temperatures of at least 50 degrees and warm soil. You can use a warming system, such as a "Wall O Water" to extend your season for these types of veggies. However, you may find buying plants will give you a jump start to a quicker to harvest.

The dates at the right are based on frost dates for a location equivalent to downtown Colorado Springs. For example, if you live at an elevation of 6000 feet, your approximate last killing frost is May 15. Your average first killing frost in the fall is October 10. To get the approximate frost dates (and recommended planting times) for your location, you must first know your elevation. Then, add (or subtract) one day for every 100 foot change in elevation for your area.
