Bloomers for Higher Elevations

Your best strategy is to seek out plants that enjoy cooler conditions. There are many perennials and annuals that will do well and bloom a long time in this type of environment.

These plants will often have extended bloom times at higher altitudes because they are not exposed to hot afternoon temperatures as they would be at a lower elevation.
