- False Aralia** (*Dizygotheca elegantissima*)
- Fern, Boston** (*Nephrolepis exalta*)
- Fern, Button** (*Pellaea rotundifolia*)
- Fern, Staghorn** (*Platycerium bifurcatum*)
- Friendship Plant** (*Pilea involucrata*)
- Gray & Oak Leaf Ivy** (*Cissus*)
- Palm, Bamboo** (*Chamaedorea seifrizii*)
- Palm, Neanthe Bella AKA Parlor Palm** (*Chamaedorea elegans*)
- Palm, Lady** (*Rhapis excelsa*)
- Peperomia** (*Peperomia obtusifolia*)
- Polka Dot Plant** (*Hypoestes*)
- Ponytail Palm** (*Beaucarnea recurvata*)
- Prayer Plant & Red Prayer Plant** (*Maranta* varieties)
- Purple Passion Plant** (*Gynura*)
- Spider Plant** (*Chlorophytum comosum*)
- Swedish Ivy** (*Plectranthus australis*)
- Venus Flytrap** (*Dionaea muscipula*)

Flowering & Seasonal Plants



- African Violets** (*Saintpaulia* spp.)
- Bromeliad** (*Guzmania* & *Neoregelia* types)
- Cape Primrose** (*Streptocarpella*) Note: True Primrose (*Primula*) IS TOXIC to cats & dogs
- Christmas Cactus** (*Schlumbergera bridgesii*)
- Gerbera Daisies**
- Goldfish Plant** (*Hypocyrta nummularia*)
- Hoya**
- Jungle Geranium** (*Ixora*)
- Jasmine** (*Jasminum* species)
- Orchids** —Specifically: *Phalaenopsis* & *Dendrobium* types
- Tahitian Bridal Veil** (*Gibasis*)

If you have a pet that chews on foliage, avoid philodendrons, pothos, dracaenas, scheffleras, peace lilies and English & Algerian ivy... these are toxic to dogs and cats.
